State-of-the-Art Cancer Care
and Services Close to Home



"We all know someone fighting cancer today," says Madeline Harlan. "Bob and I know from personal experience how important it is to have cancer care that is state-of-the-art and close to home," she adds.

The Harlans have generously accepted the role of honorary chairpersons of the Hope and Healing: Friends for Life capital campaign. They will help build the \$28 million project that will expand cancer treatment services to St. Mary's. "The same quality cancer treatment services that have been offered for years at St. Vincent Hospital will be available at St. Mary's on the West side, in a unique setting that will include gardens, spacious treatment rooms, and a focus on patient comfort," says Bob Harlan.

In Northeast Wisconsin, cancer cases continue to grow, especially as the Baby Boom generation ages. People are living longer with cancer, and there are more effective treatments available. But the demand for services is also growing. St. Vincent and St. Mary's are poised to meet that demand. Today, they provide three-fourths of the cancer care in our area.

"But Bob and I share a passion for the spiritual mission of the Hospital Sisters, and we are proud to support the state-of-the-art cancer services coming to the St. Vincent and St. Mary's Hospital Regional Cancer Collaborative."
